

**Guaranteed Transfer Admission Agreement Between
City Colleges of Chicago
And
Marquette University**

City Colleges of Chicago (“CCC”) and Marquette University (“Marquette”) agree to a cooperative relationship through this Guaranteed Admission Agreement (“Agreement”) to better serve students and facilitate the transfer process.

This Agreement offers CCC students Guaranteed Admission to Marquette to complete their bachelor's degree. Students must meet all of the requirements outlined in this Agreement to guarantee their admission to Marquette (the “Guaranteed Admission Program”).

1. Academic Requirements

- a. Students must have received a high school diploma or equivalent (GED), complete a minimum of 30 transferable credit hours, and maintain a cumulative grade point average of 2.75 on a 4.0 scale as a full-time student on all transferrable coursework taken at CCC, with no grades earned of less than C. Students asked to leave CCC for academic or non-academic reasons will be considered for guaranteed admission on a case-by-case basis.
- b. Students are required to enroll in their Marquette degree program within three years of initial enrollment in the Guaranteed Admission Program with a maximum of 60 credits (or half of the Marquette degree) that will be applied to their baccalaureate degree. Program requirements are subject to change. Courses accepted for transfer credit must follow Marquette’s Transfer Course/Credit Policy.
- c. International students must demonstrate English language proficiency as part of the final admission process. Evidence can include U.S. or Canadian university transcript showing successful academic studies over 2 or more semesters, U.S. or Canadian high school transcript showing success academic study over at least 4 semesters, submitting appropriate results from a standardized English test such as TOEFL or IELTS, or other evidence as explained in the Marquette international admissions process. <https://www.marquette.edu/oie/>

2. Admission Requirements

- a. Students must authorize CCC and Marquette to disclose their educational records, including but not limited to, transcripts, admission, and advising information as appropriate. By

completing the online participation form, students agree to allow the two institutions to share information and to allow the student to take advantage of the Reverse Transfer Agreement. Students may also receive communication from Marquette informing them of presentations, workshops, activities, student events, and visits.

- b. Students must be in good academic and disciplinary standing at CCC at the time of transfer. Students must adhere to each institution's standard policies and procedures including but not limited to those dealing with admission, enrollment in courses, transfer credits, financial aid, student conduct and discipline, academic probation, dismissal, and reentry.
- c. During enrollment in the Guaranteed Admission Program, Marquette will provide advisement to students to discuss academic program requirements and transfer credit policies. The General Education Core Curriculum (GECC) of the Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI) fulfills A.A. and A.S. degree requirements at CCC, while also satisfying Marquette degree requirements. It is recommended that students track their degree progress by working with their transfer advisor at CCC and Marquette. Students can refer to the Marquette – Transfer planning guides and Transferology for current requirements and equivalencies.
- d. This Agreement applies to Marquette programs listed in Appendix A. Note, not all undergraduate programs are available through this agreement as some programs do not offer a transfer entry option or may not have spaces to offer in a given semester. Students interested in a Marquette University program not listed in Appendix A should follow general transfer admission instructions and need not submit the Guaranteed Admission Agreement documents.
- e. The degree programs in the College of Business Administration, Opus College of Engineering, and College of Health Sciences have a higher cumulative GPA requirement of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale. Additionally, students must adhere to the listed requirements below for admission to the respective undergraduate degree program
 - I. College of Business Administration – Grades of B or better in courses equivalent to MU's ACCO 1030 Principles of Financial Accounting, MATH 1400 Elements of Calculus OR Math 1450 Calculus 1, and ECON 1103 Principles of Microeconomics.
 - II. Opus College of Engineering - A grade of B or better in courses equivalents to MU's MATH 1450 Calculus I, and PHYS 1003 General Physics with Introductory Calculus I.
 - III. College of Health Sciences – A grade of B or better in courses equivalent to MU's BIOL 1001 General Biology I and CHEM 1001 General Chemistry I.
 - IV. Students may also qualify for Marquette University scholarships, including transfer specific scholarships and the Star Scholarship


- V. Students may apply for Honors in the Disciplines at Marquette University. A complete list of Disciplinary Honors Programs, their eligibility requirements, and application processes can be found online.


3. OtherTerms

- a. All students participating in the Guaranteed Admission Program must apply to Marquette using the Common Application or the Marquette Admission Application by the Marquette application deadline for the desired entry term.
- b. In collaboration with CCC, Marquette will support "Reverse Transfer". The Reverse Transfer provides an opportunity for students who have enrolled at Marquette as transfer students from CCC to transfer their earned Marquette credits back to CCC to earn their Associate Degree. Upon student request, Marquette shall forward a transcript to CCC subject to its standard forwarding processes.
- c. Failure to meet the requirements above does not preclude the student from applying and being considered for admission to Marquette using the traditional admission process.
- d. CCC will publish a version of this document and related forms on their website so that the details of this agreement are available to students interested in participating in the program. Marquette and CCC will have the right to review and approve all advertising for the Guaranteed Admission Program. Marquette will advertise this Agreement on their website and to prospective students.
- e. This Agreement will commence upon the date of the last signed below and is effective for three years, and is subject to annual review. Any changes to the program in regard to any part of this Agreement, must be in writing so that this Agreement can be re-evaluated. Notice of changes shall be provided at least 60 days prior to the first day of instruction (at both institutions) of the academic year in which the change will be implemented.
- f. Should the program be dissolved, students who have not yet secured an offer of admission to Marquette will be considered for admission according to regular university transfer policy and deadlines.
